II. POLICY STATEMENT:

It shall be the policy of Region 10 PIHP to establish a waitlist policy in accordance with federal block grant rules. Reporting on programs providing treatment for pregnant women, injecting drug users and all other funded consumers is a federal requirement. This report monitors compliance with Sections 1923(a)(2) and 1927(b)(2) of Public Law 102-321, as amended.

III. DEFINITIONS: N/A**IV. STANDARDS:**

Region 10 PIHP may maintain a waiting list for individuals who meet criteria for substance use disorder but are not eligible for Medicaid or MICHild and for whom funding is not currently available. Admission preference is given to individual who meet criteria as Federal Priority Populations.

Per the 1915(b)(c) concurrent Medicaid Waivers, Medicaid beneficiaries are not placed on a waiting list for medically necessary services.

Region 10 PIHP will apply the MDHHS Access Standards in determining priority for immediate Access to services per the Contract Schedule A-1 (E)(7), MDHHS Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities Access Standards. Walk-In Access Standards will be adhered to per contract and per Region 10 PIHP Access to Services Policy (05-01-01).

Individuals that are eligible for public funded substance use disorder services without Medicaid that are not part of a priority population will be placed on a waiting list until funding is available.

Region 10 PIHP will apply the Priority Population Management Admission Priority Standards-Exhibit A.

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Interim services are offered to priority population individuals within 48 hours in accordance with section 96.121 of the SAPT Block Grant. All individuals placed on the wait list are contacted minimally monthly to verify contact information and interest in services. Attempts and contacts are documented in the wait list section of the (MIX) System. Individuals who are not able to be contacted or do not respond after 60 days are removed from the wait list. All individuals who are placed on the wait list are informed of this procedure in writing at the time of wait list placement. Individuals on the wait list are contacted when slots are available, re-assessed utilizing American Society of Addiction Medicine Placement Criteria and placed in the appropriate level of care.
